
When I was twenty-two years of age in August of 2000, I experienced World Youth Day in Rome. As for many of my generation, the event was life-changing for me. Surrounded by joyful, hope-filled young people from seemingly every nation and tongue, we were gathered around the Pope, sharing a common Faith and love. The Pope spoke to us of our shared family bond in the Church and invited us to give our lives in service to others. SVdP's newest 100-bed housing facility will include an animal clinic and workforce opportunities programing.

Standing at an impressive 50,000 square-feet, the new building will house three programs:

- De Paul Manor: a transitional housing facility, featuring 100 beds for unhoused seniors and adults living with disabilities.
 Formerly known as "Ozanam Manor II," De Paul Manor is modeled after Ozanam Manor, which currently provides 60 beds on SVdP's main campus and boasts a high success rate with 98% of graduated residents remaining housed and not returning to homelessness services one year after moving out.
- Marion and Bob Auray Companion Animal Clinic: SVdP's first standing animal clinic, which will partner with Midwestern University Animal Health Institute to provide much-needed pet services for those experiencing or at-risk of homelessness.
- Workforce Development Program: a training center and office space that will support SVdP transitional housing residents as they work towards stable employment



10 WAYS TO STRENGTHEN YOUR EUCHARISTIC BELIEF

PART 2

6. PRAY A HOLY HOUR

Some parishes might have an hour of Adoration once a week or once a month while others have perpetual Adoration. This is a time for prolonged prayer before the exposed Blessed Sacrament. Even if we struggle with Eucharistic belief, that time before the Blessed Sacrament opens us to God's grace. Jesus is present in the doubts that we have, wanting to reveal himself to us. Simply by being present before the monstrance and beholding the Eucharist can increase our Eucharistic belief.

7. READ JOHN

The Church's belief about the Eucharist is quite scriptural, and we have it from Jesus himself. Not only because of what he said on the night of the Last Supper, but also what he taught in the sixth chapter of John's Gospel. John 6:22-59 is Jesus' bread of life discourse.

"Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life" (John 6:54). Read those words. And reread them until you believe them.

8. RECLAIM SUNDAY MASS

Maybe part of the problem has been the laxity with which we approach our Sunday obligation. So many things seem to take priority over Sunday Mass. By making Sunday a priority, we assert that this is Jesus whom we receive, that nothing — including youth athletic tournaments or professional sports — takes priority over receiving the God of the Universe. The next time you want to skip Sunday Mass, remind yourself who it is that you will not receive. Then drop everything and run to Mass.

9. LEARN ABOUT EUCHARISTIC MIRACLES

At every Mass, a miracle happens. Bread becomes Christ's body, and wine becomes his blood. We believe this happens and wine, tastes like bread and wine, but it truly is his body and blood. There have been a few times in the Church's history that the bread and wine actually have become actual flesh and blood. You can even visit the churches where these events happened. One of the most popular is in Lanciano, Italy. I'm sure if you learn about the Eucharistic miracles and even go and see them with your own eyes, it will remove all doubt and assure you of Christ's presence in the Holy Eucharist.

10. THE EUCHARIST

There are books galore about the Eucharist. Some were written by saints, and some have been written by fellow Catholics today. I always recommend that if you have a question about something, you should research that topic for yourself. One of my favorite books is Vinny Flynn's 7 Secrets of the Eucharist (MercySong/Ignatius Press, 2006).

Other books include Abbot Anscar Vonier's A Key to the Doctrine of the Eucharist (Assumption Press, 2013) and Fr. James T. O'Connor's The Hidden Manna: A Theology of the Eucharist (Ignatius Press, 1988).

By studying more about the Church's theology of the Eucharist, we will unlock its meaning and deepen our knowledge and belief in Christ's presence.

Outlawing abortion will not affect treatment for miscarriage.

Treatment for miscarriage and abortion is not the same thing.

There is a complete moral and legal difference between losing a child through miscarriage and intentionally taking the life of a child.

In the tragic case of miscarriage, surgery may be necessary—and is an ethical treatment—to remove the remains of an unborn child who has afready died

While the same surgery is done to perform an abortion, abortions impose this procedure on a living child with the intention of ending his or her life

Women can get the lifesaving treatments they need—without abortion.

In rare cases, and in the absence of better alternatives, life-threatening maternal health conditions may require interventions that **indirectly** and **unintentionally** lead to the death of an unborn child. Abortion restrictions will not prevent women from receiving these treatments.

When the lives of mother and child are in immediate danger, the goal is to fight to save both patients Effective treatments exist that seek to save the life of the mother and never to intentionally harm her unborn child.

pregnancy, preterm delivery may be used as a lifesaving medical intervention to preserve the life of both mother and

Ectopic pregnancies

result when an embryo implants outside the fallopian tube. Sadly, such embryos cannot survive and this condition can pase serious risks to the mather. While ectopic pregnancies sometimes resolve naturally. interventions are often necessary.

When done ethically, treatment for an ectopic pregnancy is not

abortion. Ethical interventions include the removal of the damaged fallopian tube containing the embryo or, if embryo death has already occurred, medication can be used to resolve the ectopic pregnancy.

Bottom line: Abortion restrictions never prevent women from receiving life-saving treatment.2


