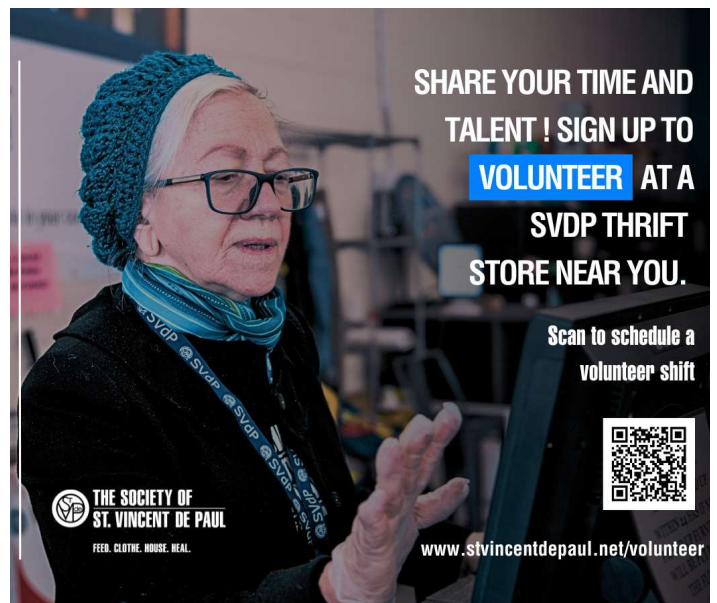

As we begin this Lenten season, many of us look for something meaningful to give up—a habit, a comfort, a treat. But Lent is also an invitation to give more: more kindness, more compassion, more of ourselves in service to one another.

What if this year, instead of only setting aside something we enjoy, we also picked up something that brings joy to others? When we serve, we grow. We strengthen our parish family. And we become living signs of the hope and mercy Lent is meant to awaken in us. This season, consider making service your Lenten promise. Together, through simple acts of love, we can reflect Christ's light in our community.

## LENTEN PENANCE

THIS YEAR, AVOID THESE COMMON MISTAKES:

- **Doing the same thing you do every year.**

Your penance isn't a habit to repeat. Consider whether your penance last year actually helped before picking it again.

- **Picking something vague.**

Define the boundaries of your penance. What exactly is included and what isn't? If you're vague, you'll struggle to stick to it & find ways around it.

- **Comparing your penance to other people's.**

Everyone's struggles are different and our Lenten penance doesn't prove our holiness. It doesn't matter how your penance compares to other people's or what others think of it. All that matters is that you think it will improve YOUR relationship with God.

- **Picking a penance that makes you feel heroic.**

Lent isn't about flexing your self-denial skills. If you tend to think that you do Lent better than other people, focus this year more on doing something less hardcore but more charitable.

- **Making other people's lives harder.**

Your penance can't be effective if it creates a burden for others. For example, don't give up coffee if it makes you irritable, become vegan if someone else cooks for you, or spend so much time in prayer that you neglect your family.

- **Focusing on self-improvement rather than penance.**

Your Lenten penance isn't a self-care challenge. Instead your focus should be on growing spiritually. For example, instead of setting a goal to lose weight, you give up snacking because you're turning to food for comfort instead of God. The end result may be the same, but the focus is on God not on self.

- **Picking something you won't be able to keep up.**

Be realistic when choosing your penance. There's no point in committing to something if you know that it's highly unlikely that you'll stick to it. While there is no shame in struggling with your penance, God doesn't want you to give Him more than you're able to.

- **Choosing something that's not connected to your actual sins or weaknesses.**

Your Lenten penance should be something that will help you grow in holiness. If you pick something that doesn't really affect you, like giving up social media if you don't really use it much, it won't deepen your relationship with God.

- **Using Lent to punish yourself.**

The purpose of Lent is not to make you feel miserable or to punish you for all your sins. If your penance makes you feel shameful and encourages self-loathing, you'll miss the love that God wants to show you this Lent.

- **Not taking into account your current circumstances.**

If Lent is a little different this year, it's important to take that into account. Consider taking it easy this year if, for example, you're facing significant mental health issues, struggling with the loss of a loved one, or suffering more than usual for some reason.

Perhaps your Lent could be spent accepting that God loves you in your current struggles.

- **Thinking penance always means giving something up.**

While it's traditional to give something up during Lent, this isn't the only way to live Lent. You could also take up something that feels hard or which is an act of charity, or you could even choose to vary your penance throughout Lent. There are no hard, fast rules.

- **Choosing a penance without praying about it.**

You can't pick a penance on your own. It needs to be done in cooperation with God. Spend some time in prayer asking God to show you what you should give up, and then as you go about your day, look for ways he might be speaking to you. Then look for confirmation by praying again and seeing how your decision feels.

# Prayer & Fasting This Lent

## lessons learned during a 60 day pilgrimage

Last year, my wife Maria and I heard the Lord call us to travel to each state's capital -- to pray in reparation for the sins of the nation against the Sacred Heart of Jesus and of the Church's clergy abuse. We answered the call and our adventure was incredible and continues to bear much fruit. In this 60 day pilgrimage, we learned many lessons including three major components: Fasting, Daily Mass and Prayer, by way of the Rosary, Adoration and spiritual reading/development.

As we approach Lent, we will share answers to many questions about Prayer & Fasting, like "Where do I even begin with fasting? Why Fast? Does fasting really do anything other than make me hungry? How do I fast safely? How do I know my fasting makes a difference?"

### ***First, Why Fast?***

In short, fasting – when practiced properly, becomes a very personal encounter with our Lord and by design brings about our conversion; allowing us to know, love and serve God (CCC 1721). The purpose is to atone for sins, prepare for Easter, and detach from the world's comforts (CCC 1434, 1438 and 2034). It is a Lenten penitential practice, uniting us with Christ's 40 days of fasting in the desert; fostering charity (through alms giving), self-discipline and prayer (communicating with God).

***Where do I even begin with Fasting?*** Maria and I found three key elements which made our decision to fast intensely effective:

- 1. Confession (CCC 1422–1498)** – being in a state of grace is foundational. Prior to confession, we perform an examination of conscience. This is crucial as we recognize our weaknesses, allowing us to approach the Lord in this sacrament with a truly humble and contrite heart. We can identify the wounds we have, which often result in our poor decisions, sinful choices and fear-based behaviors. *Without confession, preparing for a fast is like washing white sheets in dirty water, expecting them to be bright and shiny afterward, only to be disappointed with the result.*
- 2. Penance (John 20:23; James 5:16; Joel 1:13–14 & Luke 13:3)** – the conscious decision to turn away from sin is the next key step; where we place our sins at the foot of the cross and leave them there! In doing so, we break the chains of sin and allow The Holy Spirit, by His grace, to begin to heal the wounds which hold us back from the true purpose for which we were created. *Without penance, we bring all of the garbage of our life into the fast, hindering our ability to encounter our Lord, due to the distractions of our habitual sins.*
- 3. Prayer (Luke 6:12 & Psalm 55:17)** – when in a state of grace, which is the case following confession, we ask the Lord to share with us how we are to fast. It will be different for everyone and may or may not immediately be revealed. Through consistent prayer, Christ will reveal how you are to fast; as He tailors the fast for you. Without Prayer (CCC – Christian Prayer 2558–2865), we close the door on the opportunity to encounter our Lord; effectively preventing our ability to know, love and serve. Prayer is where we come to know God. As we come to know Him, he reveals to us our true purpose so we can serve Him. In serving Him, we find true meaning and joy in our lives.; allowing us to love ourselves and love God in a righteous manner.
